Historic Clifton

The Town of Clifton in June in the year 1900 was a time for graduations, celebrating and good wishes - at the "new" Clifton School at the top of the hill! Today's school graduations still include the similar "pomp & circumstance" of nearly 100 years ago! Read the article below, published in the June 17, 1917 "Fairfax Herald" and note all the names that are today reflected on the historic signs around town! Note, also, a visitor to the town was note-worthy & newspaper worthy - unlike today where we enjoy so many visitors that street parking is at a premium! Finally, read the comment about the weather – apparently 1917 carried a chilly spring, too! Enjoy!

On Tuesday night of last week, the 7th grade of the Clifton school had their commencement in the school auditorium. Mr. R. R. Buckley acted as Chairman of the meeting, and the following program was rendered by the 7th grade and 1st year at High School pupils: Song recited by class, psalm recited in concert by class, song, welcome by Miss Nina Ford, song, class history by Hobison Spraker, song, class prophesy by Miss Helen Elgin, song. The Chairman then introduced Mr. Wright, a member of the State Board of Education, who made a good address on education - past, present and future-especially dwelling on the necessity of training the hands along with the mind. Farewell by Miss Nora Brickman, song. Mr. R. R. Buckley then delivered the diplomas to the fortunate members of the class, admitting them to High School next year. The fortunate pupils were Misses Nora Brinckman, Helen Elgin, Nina Ford, Frances Robey, Maude Wood and Nancy Merchant and Messrs. Hobison Spraker, Clarence Robey and Paul Quigg. After the diplomas were delivered there was a pantomime of "Swanee River" by twelve girls. The song being sung by Miss Ida Ayre, with Miss Monroe at the piano, then "Whistling Boy" recitation by Paul Quigg. Then there was a play entitled "Young Doctor Devine." Mr. Buckley then thanked the teachers for their successful term and voiced the sentiment that we would like to see them both again next term.

Quite a number of our men and boys, who went to New York, Saturday night to spend Sunday, returned on Monday.

Rev. Alford Kelley preached a very interesting sermon in the Presbyterian church Sunday morning at 11 A.M.

The DWCVN's April 27 General Membership Meeting focused on the environment. Sarah Bocci, Campaign Director of Environment Virginia, a state-wide, citizen-based environmental advocacy organization, and Tim Sargeant, a state and local affairs manager with Dominion Power who also serves as an At-Large Member of the Fairfax County Planning Commission, were the guest speakers.

Sarah discussed the Clean Air and Clean Water Acts, the coming of off-shore wind farms to Virginia, and because of the sizable Navy presence, the positive news that wind energy will find its way to Virginia's grid more quickly. She also noted the negative impact that a rise in sea level – brought about by climate change – would have on Virginia, particularly in the Hampton Roads, Norfolk, Tidewater area.

Tim Sargeant provided an update on the Lorton Landfill or future Green Energy Park. The Fairfax County Board of Supervisors will be voting on the application in mid-June.

On May 20, DWCVN members got together at Brion's Grille in Fairfax for its famous ½ Price Hamburger Night. It was an enjoyable evening with a variety of great burgers as well as wonderful company and conversation.


