The Guild has about 10-12 artists that have committed to be part of this wonderful project. The Guild will continue promoting and garnering support; finding sponsors and patrons; and applying for federal, state, county, and other grants. These, along with artists' dues and fees, will make the Art Guild of Clifton prosper and grow and provide a haven for our artists and the citizens of Clifton who love art. They hope

eventually to tie in studio artists with performing artists and to produce art festivals, Second Saturdays, En plein air (art "in the open air" using natural light) events. All the artists are excited to teach classes and workshops in their particular area of expertise for area

children, senior citizens, and any interested artist "wannabes". The Guild would also provide educational grants to those without resources to seek out opportunities in the arts.



Clifton Horse Society contributes to many causes every year

You may have seen the Clifton Christmas parade in early December without knowing much about the group that organizes it each year ... that is, if you're not currently a "horse person." It's not a secret, however, that our locally-based Clifton Horse Society (CHS) is an active group — and involved in a surprisingly wide range of causes!

During the past several years, CHS has collaborated with the Virginia Horse Industry Board (VHIB) to promote a new equestrian site at the old Lorton prison site. CHS designed a promotional project to build a user base and wider awareness of the new Laurel Hill Equestrian Center (Center). Together, CHS and VHIB are targeting almost \$9,000 toward this awareness-building effort (you may have seen T-shirts and brochures with the Center's new logo) -- which they hope will ultimately raise a much larger amount to fund Fairfax County Park Authority's building riding paddocks, barns, and hopefully an indoor arena. Currently, there are equestrian trails and trailer parking at the Center. Fairfax4Horses and the Northern Virginia Coalition of Equestrian Organizations are also cooperating in this public-private endeavor.

Clifton Horse Society members also volunteer many community service hours each year toward maintaining the trails in our area. Some trails in our region that have benefitted from CHS maintenance have included, for example, those located in the Balmoral Subdivision, Fountainhead Regional Park, Bull Run Regional Park, and the Manassas National Battlefield. The owners of the trails include the Fairfax County Park Authority, Northern Virginia Regional Park Authority, National Park Service, and even private homeowner associations.

CHS awards an annual scholarship to a fourth-year Virginia Tech veterinary student in equine science in hopes that s/he will consider working in a suburban setting such as ours. CHS's efforts have been rewarded during the past couple of years; recent scholarship recipients are currently working for Haymarket Veterinary Service in northern Virginia and a veterinary service in nearby southern Maryland.

CHS, a non-profit 501(c)(3), also contributes financial support to worthy northern Virginia equestrian facilities such as the Marion DuPont Scott Medical Center in Leesburg, which trains veterinary students from Virginia Tech and the University of Maryland. Other worthy causes to which CHS has contributed recently include the therapeutic riding programs in northern Virginia, horse rescue organizations, and training programs at Virginia Tech's extension center in Middleburg known as the MARE Center.

In 2011, CHS sponsored the training of a group of Fairfax County first responders in large-animal emergency management at the MARE Center – 1-day and 3-day classes for which they received continuing education credits from the Commonwealth of Virginia.

Fairfax County created an Equestrian Task Force in 2011 and CHS president Jean Voss, a Clifton resident, has been appointed a member of this advisory group. The group hopes that local citizens will provide feedback on their equestrian interests via a short survey form that is available in paper format at the Clifton Saddlery or online at the Fairfax County Park Authority's web site or the CHS web site.
