

GOVERNMENT ACTIONS

Town of Clifton

The following actions were taken at the September meeting of the Clifton Town Council. For more information, call 631-1081 during evening hours.

CABLE TV CONTRACT—The council approved a motion for a public hearing Nov. 5 at 7:30 p.m. for discussion of its contract with Media General Cable TV Co. for cable TV services. At issue is whether to renew a five-year contract or enter a 15-year contract. The current agreement expires Jan. 11, 1986.

PARK DEDICATION—The council set Oct. 12 for dedication of the nearly completed, eight-acre Randolph Buckley Park at Main and Chapel streets. Former council member Randolph Buckley, for whom the park is named, is expected to attend the ceremony. Buckley lives in Florida.

FIRE STATION—The council approved a resolution to designate the fire station operated in Clifton by Fairfax County as the Clifton Fire Station. The new designation will qualify the station for \$3,000 in state funds for training and equipment.

SEWERAGE COMMITTEE—The council approved a motion to establish a committee to study replacing the town's 20-year-old, pump-and-haul sewerage system because the system is antiquated and collection and processing costs are high, officials say. Fairfax County has agreed to provide data for a new plan. Financing has not been discussed.

EXPIRED TAGS—The council agreed to send letters to town residents requesting that vehicle owners promptly renew expired license tags and registrations. The letter will also ask owners to remove from public and private property vehicles that have been idle for 90 days or more.
