

Bloodhounds Lose Trail Of Four Who Broke Jail
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Bloodhounds following the track of the four prisoners who escaped from the Fairfax County Jail at Fairfax late Saturday night lost the trail yesterday about 3 miles from Fairfax. The dogs dropped the scent shortly after the prisoners separated. Dry condition of the country was given as the reason for the failure of the hounds. The men had fled toward Clifton Station, Va.

Twenty-eight prisoners who might have followed the four through the hole in the rear of the jail stayed in the institution. The wall is three bricks thick, but old, and it was only the work of a few hours to scrape the

mortar from the bricks with an iron ralling wrenched from an old stairway. Visiting hours at the jail will be curtailed in the future, it was announced, and visitors will be closely scrutinized.

The four who escaped are Nicholas Breeden, 19 years old, of Washington, a musician indicted for assault on a Washington girl in Virginia; Taylor Edwards, 47 years old, of Clifton Station, Va., assault with a dangerous weapon; Edward Maddox, 30 years old, Accotink, Va., serving six months for being drunk and disorderly; William Parrigan, 23 years old, of Alexandria, Va., assault and robbery.

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
