Fairfax Citizens To Seek \$1,000 For Rural Park

Recreation Hall and Other Buildings Planned for Kinchelohe Tract.

FAIRFAX BUREAU OF THE POST. P. O. Box 545, Fairfax, Va. A drive to raise at least \$1,000 to start work on the rural recreation reserve in Fairfax County will be started within the next few days, it has been announced by the county committee in charge of the project.

A 40-acre site for the reserve near Clifton Station donated two weeks ago by Mrs. James U. Kinchelohe, wife of the county commissioner of revenues. Funds are needed for the erection of a recreation hall and other buildings.

James U. Kinchelohe has advised the committee that as soon as it is successful in raising \$500 he will contribute the remaining \$100.

WPA to Supply Labor. County Agricultural Agent H. B. Durr has stated that labor for the project will be furnished by the Works Progress Administration, which has offered to co-operate in building the reserve.

A. G. Grand Staffor, secretary of the Fairfax County Chamber of Commerce, told the committee he will donate up to 100 loads of gravel.

A legal committee named to work with the county committee includes W. Lewis Leigh and C. Pembroke Pettit, Fairfax attorneys, and Miss Gertrude Cobb, Edgewood Lumber Co., of the National Club of Fairfax, which has named treasurer, and Mrs. Lewis Leigh, secretary.

The county committee plans to meet again January 2 in the court house when representatives from all county organizations are expected to report their contributions and pledges.

Any organization not represented on the committee is asked to name a delegate at once, and those desiring further information regarding the project may get in touch with County Agent Durr, Miss Alice Crutcher, local home demonstration agent, or a member of the committee.

Christ Church Is Presented Century-Old Parish Record

Alexandrian Finds Relief in Effects of Great-Uncle Who Died in 1879.

Louis A. de Casanova last night presented the vestry of Christ Episcopal Church an old parish record of the church, covering the years 1818 to 1884, in the handwriting of two rectors of the church during this time. The record was given by the Rev. Dr. John P. McGuire and the Rev. Dr. Charles B. Dana.

Mr. de Casanova recently discovered the record among his books and other effects of his great uncle, William Casanova, who died in 1871. William Casanova was regular of Christ Church vestry for many years and probably removed the book from the church at the beginning of the War Between the States during which other records were either stolen or destroyed.

Among the many interesting entries in the book are those of the captivities of several of Gen. Robert E. Lee's children.

The Rev. Harry Lee Doll, rector of the church, accepted the book for the vestry.
