

Historic Clifton

The Christmas Season in Clifton seems to have always been filled with excitement over new homes, traveling relatives, stories from hither and yon and admiration for special people, young and old.

In December of 1904, Clifton was still lit by candlelight and Town Council was wrestling with the idea of installing street lights on Main St. No doubt a trip forward in time for Clifton citizens of 1904 would have dazzled their eyes with the lights now adorning their beloved town some 110 years later! One has to wonder how many heads Miss May Rogers must have turned to warrant such coverage in this holiday column! Her outing with Mr. B. Utterback must have certainly caused tongues to wag! If he was indeed the Benjamin Utterback of Mosby Ranger fame, he was no doubt still a hero in these parts, along with the Tillet boys who served under the Gray Ghost. The 1905 Reunion of the Rangers in Fredericksburg the following summer was most certainly in the works during this Christmas season!

Note, too, how very important the railroad was to this town and how well protected it was with a newly constructed tower! Imagine a time when corn meal muffins shared for a holiday dinner found their genesis at the local grist mill! And imagine, also, the welcome presence a new "miller" would have enjoyed in town! The new furniture factory and election of young people for the B.Y.P.U. (Baptist Young Peoples Union) tell us that Clifton was a hard working, enterprising and devout community. The same energy, passion, desire for town improvements, honoring of long-held holiday traditions and a wee bit o' wagging tongues still occupies our forever "Brigadoon"! Enjoy the Clifton news from December, 1904

"Clifton" - Fairfax Herald – December 16, 1904

Miss May Rogers, a daughter of J. W. Rogers, of Sharon, Mo., and niece of Mrs. G. B. Wright has been dividing her time between the two families. She leaves here for Clarke County next week to visit other relatives, after which she will return to this place before leaving for her home. Mr. Rogers is a farmer on one of those Missouri farms that yield 10 barrels of corn and 20 bushels of wheat to the acre with almost any kind of season or fertilizer.

The machinery for the new furniture factory of the McMullen Bros., of Clifton, is on the ground and they expect to be doing business in a remarkably short time. They are going to put in the planer and dress the lumber for the building that will house it.

At the last meeting of the town council the mayor appointed a committee to look into and report on the advisability of putting in some street lamps on Main Street in the town.

Rev. J. Clifton Bradford will hold services in the Baptist church on Sunday morning, Christmas Day at 11 o'clock, it being the regular 4th Sunday appointment. The B.Y.P.U. will hold regular annual meeting and election of officers on the evening of the same day. A president, vice-president and secretary will be selected. All aspirants for office will please take notice.

Miss Helen McDonald after an absence of several months, has returned to the hotel to stay with her aunt, Mrs. Bell.

Mr. Fred Larrick, railway mail clerk, has been transferred from the Washington and Greensboro mail route to a line from Harper's Ferry to Winchester over the B&O.

R. M. Kivett and Buckley Bros. have sold a lot to J. W. Puckett and a house and a lot to F. G. Cooksey on Dell Ave.

Mr. D. W. Buckley's new house on Chestnut Street is about finished. Some say it will "come off" on the 28th.

The snow has stopped the workmen on the new switch system being put in on the Southern Railway at this point. The tower is about finished.

B. C. Utterback and Miss May passed through here Monday morning on the way to the city.

The Southern R. R. Co. has moved the depot back south about 90 feet near where it was before it was moved last year.

S. H. Detwiler is "still" moving that barn.

The grist mill in the town is in full operation grinding cob or corn meal every Tuesday and Friday, which is a great convenience to the general public. Mr. Woodyard has secured the services of J. W. Puckett as miller who has had long experience in this business in Newport News, Va.

Dr. J. C. Meredith is building a new residence on his farm, two miles from Clifton on Centreville Road.

Like the November meeting, this highly informative discussion and demonstration of self-defense strategies was open to the public. Attendees also had the opportunity to participate in "hands on" self-defense exercises, practicing some effective moves that could help to fend off an attacker.

DWCNV will hold its Annual General Membership Meeting in January (date to-be-determined). In February, DWCNV members will mark the organization's 10th Anniversary with a celebration and the collection of gift cards, Metro passes, and monetary donations to benefit Operation Renewed Hope Foundation (ORHF), an organization that provides housing assistance to homeless veterans and their families. Although Northern Virginia veterans are its primary clients, ORHF also serves those in suburban Maryland and in DC, as requested by the Department of Veterans Affairs.

ORHF will use the donations DWCNV collects to help these families - many of whom have residual mental and physical health issues in addition to limited incomes, with day-to-day living expenses such as groceries, transportation, school supplies, and personal needs. Tragically, the number of veterans/veteran family members who are experiencing homelessness in the Northern Virginia/DC area averages 600+ people every day. ORHF's mission is consistent with Governor Terry McAuliffe's declaration that Virginia will end veteran homelessness by the end of 2015. Winter Visitors



As the last splashes of color from a fabulous fall display fade, many lament the coming winter months. While I am not a fan of the cold temperatures, I do look forward to the visiting winter birds. A neighbor, who knows of my bird nerd behavior, even picked up a copy of "The Birds of Winter" for me... Our winter visitors do not breed here, but spend about six or more months a year in our area before migrating back to their summer homes.

Quite possibly my favorite winter bird is the Dark-eyed Junco. Each October I anxiously wait their return and think about their amazing journey. They are the most widespread of all the backyard birds in North America. There is even a fantastic documentary about the Ordinary Extraordinary Junco - you can watch it here: juncoproject.org

News has been brewing on birding list serves that it's possible we're facing another irruption year for Snowy Owls. Young Snowy's catch rides on arctic air masses (aka Polar Vortex) in search of food. I cannot believe I saw FOUR Snowy's last winter IN VIRGINIA! They are a normally a resident of the boreal tundra, think Arctic Circle, so the arrival of at least six in the Washington, DC Metro area was unprecedented. There was one in Hawaii and the Bahamas as well. I can hardly wait to see what this year brings.

If you'd like to learn more about birds, try volunteering at one of the local Christmas bird counts. The Audubon Society started the count in 1900 as an alternate event to traditional Christmas bird hunts. It is considered the longest running citizen science based census and concentrates on monitoring and data collection across the Americas. No worries if you're a novice birder. Experience in the field is taken into consideration when building survey teams. Beginning birders are partnered with experienced mentors. For many, this event becomes a time honored family tradition.



Golala Arya, Kurdish Iranian refugee, will speak at the January 21 meeting of the Republican Women of Clifton. Arya was born in Mariwan, Kurdistan, Iran, during the Islamic revolution and came of age amid the atrocities committed against women and a backdrop of war. Her father was active in the Kurdish opposition, which led to their fleeing to Turkey and obtaining asylum in the United States. Arya will share her unique insights into the ongoing struggles in her homeland. The event will be held on January 21 at Fairview Elementary School, 5815 Ox Road, Fairfax Station, and begin at 7:00 p.m. when refreshments will be served. President Leah Durant will open the business meeting at 7:30 p.m.

Arya's parents emphasized the value of freedom and she has benefited greatly from our "Land of Opportunity."
