Historic Clifton

Autumn in Clifton, Virginia has ALWAYS included a Hallowe'en Celebration! AND a prank or two....

Our Annual Haunted Trail and associated festivities have certainly kept this theme alive – for low some 101 years! School programs, teacher salaries, scuttles at the school and even family tragedies were components of the Autumn Clifton landscape in November of 1917!

The thriving Buckley family managed to sustain a woeful tragedy and sadly men were being called off to war. The now uncommon identification of White/Colored soldiers has thankfully evaporated, yet the topic of racism is alive and well over 100 years later.

“Votes for Women!” was still the cry of the land, with the Occoquan Workhouse Night of Terror jailing of over 40 Suffragists occurring only five days after the publication of this newspaper. I often think: “Oh, Humans, will we EVER get it right?” The themes seem universal in our nation’s history and legacy. Enjoy this column from the “Fairfax Herald”, November 9, 2017.

“Fairfax Herald” – November 9, 1917

The Hallowe'en party given by the teachers and pupils of the Clifton High School, Tuesday night of last week, was quite a success. The following program was rendered and enjoyed by all: “One, Two Three, Who are We”, by girls from the primary grades, “Brownie Drill” by seven boys from 5th and 6th grades. “Four Black Cats” by four boys from 5th and 6th grades. “Who Was Scared?” by girls from high school. “Ghost” by Miss Fannie Robey. “We Are Creepy Little Scarecrows,” by several boys and girls from primary grades. “Hallowe'en Party” by girls and boys from Miss Smith’s room. Mrs. Hodge gave us some good music during the intermissions. After the program, there was a grab bag, gypsy fortune teller and a jig dance by young Smith. Ice cream was sold and a cake voted on for the most popular lady. The voting soon centered on two of the teachers, and after a very exciting contest, Miss Crewe won the cake, with Miss Holmes a close second. The cake brought about \$14.00. The entire proceeds from the entertainment was about \$50.00.

Hallowe'en was celebrated Wednesday night by the usual parade of younger people and the usual pranks of lifting gates off and hiding them, also mail boxes. They put an old wagon on the school porch!

Thursday morning about 8 o'clock Mr. Milton Buckley's house was burned to the ground, with quite a large part of the contents. Mr. Buckley was away at the time, and when the fire, which was in the roof, was discovered, it was too far gone to save the house, and much of the contents upstairs. Mrs. Buckley lost all of her canned fruit and vegetables (about 200 cans), 9 barrels of apples and all of their sweet potatoes. The house was the oldest one in the neighborhood, having been built 250 years ago, and was used in “Ye olden times” as a tavern and wagon stand; and there has been four generations of Buckley family under its roof. Mr. and Mrs. Buckley and daughter, Anna, are stopping with their son, Mr. Rush Buckley, until they can build another one.

The School League met Friday afternoon of last week. The committee on the road up the hill was authorized to go to work at their earliest opportunity. It was reported that the school would pay Miss Hodge \$5.00 per month towards her salary and the League would like to raise the balance. A committee of three gentlemen was appointed to keep order at any entertainment, given in the school house in the future. The committee appointed, if they are willing to serve, the Messrs. Joshua Buckley, Maurice Davis and Roger Cross. Mrs. Buckley, after the business was over, resigned her position as President of the League. Her resignation was accepted with regret by the League, and Rev. W. F. Neff was elected President. The League then adjourned to meet again the first Friday in December.

Historic Clifton

The Community Fair was held last Saturday. The basketball team played two games, one in the morning with the Manassas second team and one in the afternoon with the Manassas first team. The Clifton team was beaten 14 to 6 in the morning and 22 to 6 in the afternoon, but as the Manassas girls played by different rules, all thought the Clifton girls did well to make any scores at all. The exhibits were very good, the farm products being very much more of an exhibit than last year and of better quality. After lunch, the speaking began: Miss Edith Thompson gave us an excellent talk on how to save and store produce. Her talk was especially made to the boys and girls as they were much in the majority. Mr. Sanders of the Manassas Agriculture school then gave us a talk, as well.

The following men, white and colored were sent from Fairfax, Wednesday morning, to Camp Lee, Petersburg, VA, to be added to the Fairfax County quota now in training for army duty. Twenty-three white men were called but only 19 reported, and of 19 colored men called, only 9 reported. The names of the men sent follows:



To date, Fairfax County has sent, allowing for those turned down by the army doctors at Camp Lee, 128 men. That leaves 28 men yet needed to complete the county quota of 157. It is believed that out of the cases outstanding and enlistments credited to the county, about 20 more names will be added, leaving 9 yet to be obtained. Before ordering another examination of men subject to draft, from which to obtain the nine wanted, the local exemption boards are waiting on decisions of the District board in cases still pending before it.

Also, of further interest, an adjacent column referencing the recent election reads, "...in Fairfax out of a total vote of about 150, only 82 votes were polled and the same proportion holds good throughout the county. The county vote in detail will be published next week...."

...Woman's suffrage won in New York, but is beaten in Ohio. The prohibition ticket is reported to have won in New Mexico, but Ohio remains in the wet column. Maryland elects a Republican legislature.




